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EYFS

Squirrels - We have had another wonderful and busy week in Squirrels! This week, we have been meeting and holding the chicks. The children have been so excited and gentle in their approach towards the chicks! We have also been developing our fine motor skills using Easter crafts and tweezers to pick up the soft eggs and place them in the pot. We have also been practicing throwing and catching in the hall. Well done Squirrels! Super ball skills!

Foxes - What a lovely week! The children have been learning all about the lifecycle of a hen and have enjoyed observing the chicks throughout the week to see how they have changed and grown. Everyone has been keen to look after the chicks and to help clean the brooder out and make sure the chicks always have enough food and water. Lots of children were brave enough to hold or stroke the chicks and everyone remembered to be very gentle with them. This week, we have also created some lovely chick artwork and observational paintings of flowers.

Badgers & Owls - What a fantastic week in Reception! In Literacy, we have completed our work on our focused story; 'The Pirates Are Coming' and some of the children have enjoyed making their own story maps and pirate stories. In PE, the children have had fun developing their ball skills, using their hands to throw, catch and bounce balls with increasing control. In Maths, we have worked hard on our number bonds to 5 and 10, using objects to help us make these numbers in different ways. Thank you so much for the wonderful work around sea creatures that many of you have created with the children. The children have loved sharing their work with us and we have learned some amazing facts!

Acorns - This week the children in Acorns have enjoyed singing and signing lots of songs - we are doing really well with sitting and staying engaged during our singing activities. We have loved our messy play this week, which started off with marshmallow playdough. The children had a wonderful time feeling, rolling and making shapes with the dough. Towards the end of the week we enjoyed scooping and pouring porridge oats. Our favourite part was when we added water and we could make a big mess!

<u>KS1</u>

Year 1 - In English, we wrote our own versions of the story 'The Curious Case of the Missing Mammoth'. We used capital letters, finger spaces, full stops, exclamation marks and question marks. We added detail to our story using adjectives, prefixes and suffixes. Our teachers were so impressed!

In Maths, we have continued our work on place value to 50, using number squares to find one more or one less and estimate missing numbers. We continued our History unit on Mary Anning by researching and recording facts about her. In Science, we sorted metal and plastic toys by their properties and discussed their common uses. It was brilliant to see your odd socks and crazy hair this week! Thank you for supporting these great causes.

Year 2 - In English this week, we have completed our work based around 'The Curious Case of the 'Missing Mammoth' by Ellie Hattie. The children planned and wrote their own version of the story. They then proofread their writing to check it made sense and that it had the correct punctuation. In shared reading, we have continued reading the wonderful 'Claude in the City' by Alex T. Smith to help develop our comprehension strategies. This includes answering questions by using the strategy of reading and retrieving the correct information and making inferences based on what has been read. In Mathematics, we have continued learning about capacity and temperature. The children have also been revisiting strategies for adding and subtracting two 2-digit numbers. As part of our work in History, the children completed a timeline of Mary Anning's life and sketched fossils.

Whole School Attendance 94.62% Reporting Children's Absence

School must be informed of children's absence on the first day by ringing 0151 329 3164 and pressing 1 to leave a message. This must be done before 9am. Please ensure you provide the child's name, class and reason for absence.

If your child is absent due to sickness or diarrhoea, they will be unable to return to school for 48hrs after their last episode. This is inline with the Public Health Agency guidance to reduce the risk of the illness spreading.

Any absence not explained is registered as unauthorised.

Appointments

Parents and carers should make every effort to book routine dental and GP appointments outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, children should only be absent for the time needed for the appointment and travel to and from.

For any prebooked medical appointments copies of appointment letters can be emailed to n.brown@woodlands.cheshire.sch.uk in advance so that a note can be added to the register. The school will work with all families on an individual basis if medical absences exceed the maximum threshold.

Can we politely request that parents inform school of any upcoming holidays via the Leave of Absence forms which can be collected from the school offices. These forms should be completed and handed to school 4 working weeks in advance of the first day of absence.

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Childcare Choices: Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for.

The Childcare Choices website brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare schemes together and get the most out of it. Visit the site at https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/ to check your eligibility and see if you can benefit from additional support.

And from this year even more help is on the way:

From **April 2024**, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.

From **September 2024**, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.

From **September 2025**, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

If you are eligible, you need to apply for your funding at https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-childcare-if-youre-working.

You do not need to apply if you are only claiming the standard 15hrs from the term after your child's 3rd birthday. This is automatically in place for all children of that age.

Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children – from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as 'wraparound care'.
