• **Welcome and introductions**

All welcomed to the Parents Forum Meeting and thanked them for attending this evening.

• **Behaviour Policy review**

The views of children and staff had been gathered in relation to the behaviour policy and these were shared with parents at the meeting. Points raised by staff were discussed:

- **The time it takes for children to colour the chart.** It was agreed that this was offset by the children valuing their card and it being special to them. It was agreed that the lily pads could be marked rather than coloured if it was quicker
- **Could there be a wallchart rather than individual booklets?** Feedback is that the children are proud of their booklet and by displaying it on the wall it might impact negatively on self-esteem and well-being of those not achieving the green
- **Is it unfair that children who are absent still get to colour their lily pad in?** The children do not chose f they are on holiday or off ill so the orange will remain. Also children will have to be in school and get green to achieve unless they are absent for 20 days which is highly unlikely
