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- 1. Children to recap what is meant by physical and human features by playing a sorting game (see Twinkl resource). (Human features are made by humans and physical features are naturally occurring.)
- 2. Children research **one** of the following deserts: The Sahara, The Gobi Desert or The Canadian Arctic Tundra.

- 3. Children to use online resources to fill in their research table.
- 4. Children to choose a way to present their research. For example, a poster, a PowerPoint, model or booklet.
