What Parents & Educators Need to Know about

POP-UP ADS

WARNI

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? Pop-up advertisements have been a staple of the internet since they were first introduced in the late 1890s. This form of advertising causes a small window or banner to appear in the foreground while semeone is browsing a website. Although these adverts are merely irritating for most

IGN UP TOD PRIVACY RISK

Many app and game developers will collect their users' personal data, such as their name, address, email address, gestication information, unique numerical identifiers, shotss and payment information. If a child licks on an illegitimate pap-up laced with nativars, all this information could be put at

DECEPTIVE TACTICS

Children sometimes don't understand that adverts (including pap-ups) are designed to sell a product - and san't disting uish between a legitimate feature of a site and an advertisement. Video games, for example, can be full of pap-up and that tempt users into spending money, yet they might take the form of a policionary as article.

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

While same adverts are targeted based on a user's interests and activity online, that isn't always the case. This means that children may unfortunately be exposed to ade for age—inapprepriate goods or services such as tabacco products, alcohel and gambling sites.

RACKING UP BILLS

If a child has access to a payment card on their device — be it a smartphone, laptop, or tablet — they could very quickly rack up a massive bill by interacting with pay—up adverte and buying products shown to them. Try to keep a close eye on their spending.

MALWARE RISK

Most pop-ups from reputable advertisers are safe. However, in some cases, pop-ups can trick you into downloading malware – whereby eybercriminals install software on your device, allowing them to access your sensitive data. It can be difficult to know if malware has been installed on your device, so your best option is to avoid engaging with these pop-ups altogether. Be warry of sites that suddenly bombard you

BEHAVIOURAL IMPACT

Research has found that pop-up ads can even have an impact on children's behaviour. Some of these adverts use manipulative tostice that take advantage of children's evengmental vulnerabilities, intentionally or otherwise. This approach may cause a child's mood to shift becoming more stubborn, for example, if they begin wanting their parents to have a serific product for them.

REMOVE

Advice for Parents & Educators

START A CONVERSATION

It's important to have regular conversations with children about online advertising so that they understand the risks of interacting with populps. For example, if a child asks for a product which has been advertised to them online, ask them why they want it and how they found it this will present an apportunity talk youngsters through the tactics used in enline marketing.

SPOT THE SIGNS

If you're concerned that a child may be following pop-up ads to make online purchases or viewing sentent that could be harmful, it's important to be able to spot the signs. Due to the often-manipulative nature of these adverts, children who interact with them regularly may show signs of distraction, stubbornness and an increasingly materialistic

MON/TOR CONTENT

SKIP AD>

It can aften be difficult to spot when a pop-up advert is malicious – even more so for impressionable younger users. It's important to menitor the content they're consuming to prevent them from clicking on something dangerous. If a pop-up ad seems too good be true – promising a free iPad, for example – it probably is.

PRIVACY SETTINGS

Most madern devices have privacy settings that let you limit the amount of advertising a child is subjected to while using apps or browning the internet. You may also want to speak to teachers about avoiding sites and apps with advertising, as well as adjusting digital privacy settings on any education technology they use.

LIMIT SPENDING

Try to stay aware of what children are spending and ensure that payment defails aren't linked to or saved on the gaming platform that they use. Most video games and internet-enabled devices have settings that can help you manage what children can or cannot

CUT DOWN ON SCREEN TIME

Given the prevalence of pop-up ads (which can appear on everything from smartphones and tablets to internet-connected toys and games), it might be beneficial to limit the time children spend on digital devices to curb their exposure to digital advertising.



KS1

Year 1 - We have had a busy first week back in Year 1. We have enjoyed exploring clues to discover which story we will be focusing on in English this term. We have been learning about place value to 100 in Maths, counting the amount of tens and ones in each number. In Forest School, we observed natural objects and created a hedgehog home! We look forward to seeing whether anyone will move in! We are also looking forward to observing the growth of our bean seeds, which we planted this week in Science. In Geography, we have recapped map reading and the countries which make up the United Kingdom.

Year 2 - It was lovely to welcome the children back after their half term break and listen to them chatting about what they had got up to during their time off. They all looked refreshed and eager to start learning. In English, we have started using the excellent 'Goldilocks and Just the One Bear' by Leigh Hodgkinson to inspire our English work. The children have been writing diary entries and concentrating on using different types of punctuation. This has included using apostrophes, exclamation and question marks. In Mathematics, we have started learning about time. The focus this week has been on learning to recognise 'o'clock' and 'half past the hour'. In Science, the children have continued to learn about plants. They have been making observations about the different plants and talking about what plants need to grow and be healthy.

In Maths, Y3 have continued their unit of work on money. They have been working hard to add and subtract given amounts of money using both the number line and column methods. Y4 have continued to work on decimals; partitioning them. This has been tricky, but they have shown great perseverance. We are incredibly proud of the Y4 children who have taken their multiplication times tables check this week. They have been superstars. If your child is yet to take it, they will do so this coming week.

Year 5 & 6 - It has been a busy week back in UKS2! In English this week, Y5 have been busy investigating their new class text 'Manfish'. They have worked on editing and redrafting previous pieces and have also begun work on their own explanation texts for humans visiting a giant world. In Maths, Y5 have been working very hard on their topic of angles. They have investigated angles in a straight line and around a point, as well as angles in different shapes.
