In Maths, we have enjoyed making simple patterns; painting and printing with leaves. We have also had fun counting spiders, mice and other spooky objects for Halloween. Foxes loved exploring pumpkins this week. We talked about the different sizes and how heavy they were. We also had fun scooping them out to find out what's inside them! We have then used our phonic knowledge to write labels for our pictures. In Maths, we have been exploring numbers 1, 2 and 3. The children have been representing these numbers in different ways and practising to subitise (say how many without counting). The children have also been busy practising and performing the poem 'The Nut Tree' by Julia Donaldson. Well done, Reception! It has been lovely catching up with all of the grown ups this week and celebrating how well the children have all settled into school.

Acorns - This week, our Acorns have been creating some fantastic pumpkin art for Halloween! We have enjoyed learning a new shapes song in Maths and looking at circles, triangles, squares and rectangles. It has been wonderful sharing how well the children have been doing during Parent's Evening this week. Thank you to all our parents for your support - we hope you have a lovely half term!

Year 2 - In English, we have completed our work on the excellent 'Troll Swap'. The children have written their stories and we have concentrated on re-reading the work to ensure it makes sense. The children have also been learning about syllables and how they can help with the spelling of longer words. In Mathematics, the children have started to learn about addition and subtraction using two 2-digit numbers and the focus has been on revisiting number bonds to 10. In Geography, we have been learning about the countries that make up the United Kingdom and the seas around the British Isles. Thank you for your support throughout this first half term. The children have been amazing and they are ready for a well-deserved rest. We hope they have an enjoyable break and we look forward to the next half term.

Year 3 & 4 - At Parents Evening this week, it has been wonderful to celebrate how well the children have settled into the Autumn Term and to be able to share in their achievements. Also, thank you to those who attended drop in - it is always lovely to see the children sharing their work. In English this week, we have worked hard to innovate our story 'Gorilla', changing one or more elements. Using the story mountain structure, we wrote the stories using noun phrases for detail and fronted adverbials (Y4) for interest. We cannot wait to publish these after half term! In Maths, Y3 have been continuing to embed our understanding of addition, particularly pattern spotting within numbers. In Y4, we have been using the inverse operation to check our answers and calculate using efficient methods. Please continue to encourage your children to practise their times tables frequently at home. Y4 children may wish to challenge themselves with URBRAINY MTC check. We would like to wish all our children and families a restful half term and we look forward to continue our learning journey in Autumn Term 2 - which involves Christmas! Many thanks

Year 5 & 6 - It has been a fantastic last week of term for Y5 and Y6! In English, Y5/6 finished their incredible alternative narratives about 'Jub' and the 'Witch' from 'The Lost Happy Endings'. They have also worked hard on spelling assessments and the UKS2 are so proud of the progress shown by the children from the start of the year. Keep it up, team! In Reading, Y5/6 also finished reading 'Hansel and Gretel' by Neil Gaiman and showed off their fabulous summarising skills when retelling the key events of the text. In Maths this week, Y5 finished their first multiplication and division unit and completed an assessment before enjoying some exciting Halloween maths and arithmetic revision. Y6 meanwhile, have investigated the order of operations and have reasoned from known facts. In addition, Y6 completed their four operations assessment and will be moving onto fractions after half term! In Science, the Y5/6 classes had lots of fun investigating and explaining the effects of air resistance in their 'Egg Sheeran' parachute experiments! In Computing, the children have thought carefully about their digital footprints and their online identity, designing their own avatars and explaining reasons why people might change their online identity. The UKS2 team would like to thank the Y5/6 parents and carers for all of their support this half term. It was wonderful to speak to so many of you this week at parents evening about how your children have settled in to UKS2. Thank you also to the Y5/6 children for their hard work this year so far. Dear Parents & Carers,

The School Office has noticed a huge increase in children regularly coming into school without water bottles. Whilst we may have previously provided children with a temporary bottle to use for the day, we must advise that from the 4th November 2024, we will no longer be able to accommodate this especially as we are heading into Cold and Flu season.

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Drinking enough water during the day, particularly when our children are at school and subject to high energy requirements both in the class and in the playground, will have a significant impact on their behaviour and learning capacity, the two usually go hand in hand! Access to hydration is key in performing to the best of your abilities - the simple act of drinking a glass of water can boost a person's concentration, directly affecting their ability to learn and recall information. As such, we ask that for the new half term, you ensure you send your child into school with a bottle of water each and every day. Other liquids are only allowed with prior agreement from school.

Reporting Children's Absence

School must be informed of children's absence on the first day by ringing 0151 329 3164 and pressing 1 to leave a message. This must be done before 9am. Please ensure you provide the child's name, class and reason for absence.

If your child is absent due to sickness or diarrhoea, they will be unable to return to school for 48hrs after their last episode. This is inline with the Public Health Agency Guidance to reduce the risk of the illness spreading. Any absence not explained is registered as unauthorised.

Appointments

Parents and carers should make every effort to book routine dental and GP appointments outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, children should only be absent for the time needed for the appointment and travel to and from.

For any prebooked medical appointments copies of appointment letters can be emailed to n.brown@woodlands.cheshire.sch.uk in advance so that a note can be added to the register. The school will work with all families on an individual basis if medical absences exceed the maximum threshold.

Holidays During Term Time

Can we politely request that parents inform school of any upcoming holidays, regardless of length, via the Exceptional Leave of Absence forms which can be collected from the school office. These forms should be completed and handed to school 4 working weeks in advance of the first day of absence.


