Foxes - Another busy week in Foxes! On Monday, we commemorated Remembrance Day by creating some beautiful poppies and the children were very respectful as we joined the rest of the school for a minute's silence. Well done Foxes.

In Literacy, we introduced our new focussed story; 'I'm Going to Eat an Ant' and the children enjoyed going for a minibeast hunt around the class room and they also enjoyed drawing their favourite mini beasts! In Maths, we have enjoyed counting objects and exploring numbers from 0 to 3. We have also begun to subitise numbers to 3. (Recognising the amount quickly, without counting)

Foxes loved their PE sessions this week, travelling in different ways and carrying out their second CoJo mission where they got to know "Charlie Communication". This time the children were challenged to guide a friend over an obstacle course by giving clear instructions!

KS1

Year 1 - 1AA & 1LW - Another busy week in Year 1!

On Monday we welcomed Ann into school and she spoke to us about Judaism, our RE topic at the moment. She taught us about Shabbat, how Jewish families prepare for it and what happens on the day. We learnt a Jewish song and how to say hello to each other in Hebrew.

In English, the children have worked on changing singular nouns into plural nouns by adding the suffix -s or -es. We wrote about what Plop the owl could see from his branch and thought about how he was feeling before he flew down and spoke to the boy.

In Maths, we have used part whole models and bar models to create fact families of number sentences.

In Science, we have planned an investigation to measure rainfall and made our own rain gauge. We talked about the type of container needed and made predictions on how much rain we thought we would collect.

In 1KS this week, we have drawn around and named some 2D shapes and we have done some lovely owl colouring. We are learning a shape song and we have become more familiar with the Owl Babies story. We see our faces with our names every day now and practice our writing. We played in the hall on the apparatus again and created Pudsey pictures with bingo dabbers on Childen in Need day.

Year 2 -

This week, in English, we have been using the wonderful The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark by Jill Tomlinson to inspire our English work. The children have been learning to change adjectives into adverbs and adding -ly to the end of words. They have written about fireworks and described how Plop felt as he took his first flight. As part of our English work, the children have also been learning to spell words with the diagraphs ay and oy. During our shared reading sessions, the children have been learning about the features of a non-fiction text. This has included using a contents page. In Maths, we have continued learning about number bonds to 100 and solving mathematical problems.

KS2

Year 3 & 4 - Another busy week in Y3/4 with designing odd socks as a symbol for anti-bullying week, marking Remembrance Day respectfully and taking part in wonderful gymnastics sessions creating bridges in unison. In English this week, we were very excited to write creative setting descriptions about Diagon Alley from Harry Potter. The children brought the scene to life brilliantly using high quality language choices, noun phrases and fronted adverbials. Later in the week, we moved back to our narrative, 'Leon and the Place Between' to focus on sentence construction using co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions. In Maths, our Y3 children have been practising both column addition and subtractions with and without exchanging. They have used this skill to solve worded problems involving both one and two steps. Y4 have now begun their unit of work on multiplication. As part of this, they have been practising speedy recall of their 3,4,6 and 8 times tables in and out of order. Please encourage them to practise these in short bursts, regularly.

Christmas songs - As we begin to prepare for our Christmas concerts at Hope Farm Church, we have been singing some familiar and unfamiliar Christmas songs. On our school website (Y3/4 page) there are two songs with lyrics for the children to practise at home.

Year 5 & 6—It has been a brilliant week in UKS2!

On Wednesday and Thursday, Y5/6 completed their fantastic artwork for this half term, inspired by the works of Maggi Hambling. They evaluated Maggi's work, experimented with painting techniques and created their own colour palettes inspired by wave art. Then, Y5/Y6 created their own wave art using acrylic paint and other materials to create texture and depth. We are so impressed with their pieces!

In Maths this week, Y6 have been working on addition and subtraction of fractions, including adding and subtracting mixed number fractions. Y5 meanwhile have been converting fractions to the same denominators in order to complete addition and subtraction of fractions within 1 whole.

In English, Y5/6 have learnt more about the fascinating daredevil that was Annie Edson Taylor. They discovered that she loved to travel and previously owned a charm school before she decided - at the age of 62 - that she would be the first person to travel down Niagara Falls in a BARREL! Y5/6 then worked hard on creating a variety of multi-clause sentences all about Annie.

We wanted to say a big well done to our Y5/6 Junior Joe's who have got stuck into their roles this week and have been fantastic leaders at lunch time in KS1 and KS2. Keep up the great work team!

Whole School Attendance 94.77% Reporting Children's Absence

School must be informed of children's absence on the first day by ringing 0151 329 3164 and pressing 1 to leave a message. This must be done before 9am. Please ensure you provide the child's name, class and reason for absence.

If your child is absent due to sickness or diarrhoea, they will be unable to return to school for 48hrs after their last episode. This is inline with the Public Health Agency Guidance to reduce the risk of the illness spreading. Any absence not explained is registered as unauthorised.

Appointments

Parents and carers should make every effort to book routine dental and GP appointments outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, children should only be absent for the time needed for the appointment and travel to and from.

For any prebooked medical appointments copies of appointment letters can be emailed to n.brown@woodlands.cheshire.sch.uk in advance so that a note can be added to the register. The school will work with all families on an individual basis if medical absences exceed the maximum threshold.

Holidays During Term Time

Can we politely request that parents inform school of any upcoming holidays, regardless of length, via the Exceptional Leave of Absence forms which can be collected from the school office. These forms should be completed and handed to school 4 working weeks in advance of the first day of absence.

We aim to reply to you within 10 working days of your application.

What?


Mystery readers can bring in a book from home or one chosen by the teacher selected from our class libraries.
